Personal Preparation

BUT!

He is ***NOT*** appointing apostles today

Resurrection



In what way does our righteous standing before God depend on the resurrection of Christ?

- His resurrection is the proof that His sacrifice for our sins was acceptable to God the Father.

How is the Christian life dependent on the resurrection of Christ?

- Christ **IS** our Christian life! If Christ is not alive, then there is no Christian life.



<p>¹ Paul, an apostle (not <i>sent</i> from men nor through the agency of man, but through Jesus Christ and God the Father, who raised Him from the dead), ² and all the brethren who are with me, To the churches of Galatia:</p>	<p>Paul's apostleship defended. (Primarily Ch 1-2)</p>
<p>³ <u>Grace</u> to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ, ⁴ who gave Himself for our sins...</p>	<p>Defense of the <u>grace principle</u> of provided righteousness. (On the basis of the cross) (2:16 - 4:31)</p>
<p>...so that He might <u>rescue</u> [liberate, free] us from this present evil age, according to the will of our God and Father, ⁵ to whom <i>be</i> the glory forevermore. Amen.</p>	<p>The fruitful walk of <u>liberty</u>. Which is the application of the <u>principle</u> of provided righteousness. (It was for freedom that Christ set us free; <u>therefore</u> keep standing... 5:1) (Ch 5-6)</p>
