**Read Chapter 15:1-7 and answer the following questions?**

**The strong here** are believers whose understanding of the Word frees them from religious misgivings.

**The weaker** are believers whose understanding of the Word is so limited, that they consider some things which are right in themselves, to be wrong for them.

9. What is the purpose of this oneness of mind in Christ Jesus?
10. Verse 7 says *Therefore, accept one another, just as Christ also accepted us to the glory of God.* Is Acceptance on the bases of Who Christ is and has done?
