

"the end of all things" was near in the past and continues to be near up into the present and on into the future – denotes a state of permanence

- "the end of all things" can happen at any moment
- all things = the way things are now
- the cosmos is not going to end (cease to exist)
- God's plan is for a new heaven and new earth
- end = termination, of time or purpose lit: end goal or end design is in view
- Peter is talking about God's game plan*
- Peter is saying the goal is right there in sight*
- This is a statement about the imminent return of Christ

therefore - based on the impending return of Christ !!

- 1st be of sound judgment sophroneo to use sound judgment and moderation, to be self-disciplined
- McCalley calls it a "balanced mind"

2nd - sober - napho - means to be sober as over against being drunk and further carries the idea of a cool, calm, collected mind. McCalley

above all – lit: before all things in order of importance keep fervent in your love for one another

fervent - ektenēs - stretched out, continual, intense

- This word is used to describe a horse at full gallop and a runner straining for the tape at the finish line of a race. Vine
- remember "love" is a fruit of the spirit
- as we walk by the Spirit this love can be manifested
- our part is to exercise faith

for one another – among yourselves

⁸ Above all, keep fervent in your love for one another, because love covers a multitude of sins.

love covers a multitude of sins

This tells us about the importance of our love for one another (our brother or sister in Christ).

covers - kalyptō - to envelop, wrap around as bark, skin, shell or plaster, to cover over

But let's recall first, how did Christ's love cover all sins:

- 1 John 2:2 and He Himself is the propitiation for our sins;
 and not for ours only, but also for those of the whole world.
- 1 John 4:10 In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins.
- 1 John 4:14 We have seen and testify that the Father has sent the Son to be the Savior of the world.

Christ's love covers a multitude of sins in the believer's life!

- · Love is patient,
- · love is kind and is not jealous;
- love does not brag and is not arrogant,
- (love) does not act unbecomingly;

- (love) does not rejoice in unrighteousness, but rejoices with the truth;
- (love) bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

 - These spiritual gifts are discussed in 1 Cor. 12-14, Rom. 12 and Eph. 4
 - Certain gifts are clearly the possession of the Church today: (1) the gift of teaching, (2) the gift of helping or ministering, (3) the gift of administration or ruling, (4) the gift of evangelism, (5) the gift of being a pastor, (6) the gift of exhortation, (7) the gift of giving, and (8) the gift of showing mercy.
