<sup>13</sup> But rejoice, inasmuch as ye are partakers of Christ's sufferings; that, when his glory shall be revealed, ye may be glad also with exceeding joy.

<sup>14</sup> If ye be reproached for the name of Christ, happy are ye; for the spirit of glory and of God resteth upon you: on their part he is evil spoken of, but on your part he is glorified.

Beloved, Άγαπητοί, adjective vocative masculine plural no degree from ἀγαπητός Friberg,

(1) beloved, dear, very much loved (AC 15.25; possibly 1T 6.2);

(2) of one not only greatly loved but also unique, the only one of a class only beloved, one dear (MT 3.17):

(3) worthy of love (probably 1T 6.2)

### do not be surprised

Literally: "Beloved, don't be surprised"

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### The Facts of Suffering 1 Peter 4:12-14

12 Beloved, do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal among you, which comes upon you for your testing, as though some strange thing were happening to you;

Implied by the dative case use in the direct object, burning.

fiery ordeal (Note: ordeal is not in original, it is supplied by translators) πυρώσει noun dative feminine singular from πύρωσις

literally, as an action burning (RV 18.9);

figuratively, of suffering sent by God for the spiritual refinement of believers fiery test, painful suffering (1P 4.12)

Question: Is this real burning by men who judged them worthy of death, or is this figurative of painful suffering that is

by man to discredit, or abuse them with false accusations,

by God to refine them?

Answer: I believe Peter may be referring to the real burning under the rule of Nero in Rome. He burned as lights for his home parties, anyone who would not worship him as God

γινομένη, participle present middle or passive deponent dative fem sing from γίνομαι to come into being, to happen, to become

#### Present tense

indicates this was going on continually in the present time

### Middle or Passive (same form in original)

Indicates this was coming to be real for them while being done to them

This one word follows the phrase "for your testing" in the original,

So an original word order literal translation is "for your testing this is happening"

# for your testing πρὸς πειρασμὸν ὑμῖν

πρὸς preposition used here to show or introduce a purpose;

As in Eph 4:12 for  $(\pi\rho\delta\varsigma)$  for the purpose of) the equipping of the saints for  $(\epsilon i\varsigma)$  toward) the work of service, to  $(\epsilon i\varsigma)$  toward) the building up of the body of Christ;

πειρασμὸν noun accusative masculine singular from πειρασμός testing ὑμῖν pronoun personal dative plural from σύ you plural

In James the two Greek works of testing are in contrast... This word πειρασμός is never done by God, always is done by man! James 1:13 Let no one say when he is tempted, "I am being tempted by God"; for God cannot be tempted by evil, and He Himself does not tempt anyone. (each is πειράζω the verb form of πειρασμός)

1 Peter shows this same contrast the word δοκιμάζω is used in 1 Pt 1:7, "so that the proof of your faith, being more precious than gold which is perishable, even though tested (δοκιμάζω) by fire, may be found to result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ," (here proof of your faith is shown to be God's testing)

Πειρασμός in 4:12 is testing that distorts reality and may cause one to sin Δοκιμάζω in 1:7 is testing to purify what is believed and reveal what is reality

ὑμῖν pronoun personal dative plural from σύ to you

συμβαίνοντος participle pres active genitive neuter sing from συμβαίνω Gingrich, meet, happen, come about

Mk 10:32; Ac 20:19; 21:35; 1 Cor 10:11; 1 Pt 4:12; 2 Pt 2:22.

Present tense, is happening

Literally this is "as though an unheard of thing to you is happening"

Τοῖς παθήμασιν def article+noun dative neuter pl from ὁ πάθημα *the sufferings* τοῦ χριστοῦ def article + noun gen masc sing from ὁ Χριστός of *the Christ* 

As man and God before crucifixion he suffered from men; ridicule, false accusations, rejection of who he was, and the testing by Satan to sin against Himself. This is our shared suffering. We too are ridiculed, slandered, rejected, and tested to sin by men, ourselves, and Satan.

As man and God, on the cross He died, to suffer the penalty of our sins. This we do not share with Him, He suffered for us alone. This was His gift for us.

Literally: "Instead, to the degree that you all are sharing the sufferings of the Christ"

### keep on rejoicing

χαίρετε, verb imperative pres act 2nd pers pl from χαίρω rejoice, be glad, be delighted

**example** (JN 3.29) "He who has the bride is the bridegroom; but the friend of the bridegroom, who stands and hears him, **rejoices greatly** because of the bridegroom's voice. So this joy of mine has been made full."

Imperative mood, this is a command,

Present tense, to be done continuously

Question: Why use a command here?

Answer: God wanted us to know His view.

 He wants His life, all of His goodness, His glory, to be seen on earth, thru us.
 He wants us to be delighted at His revelation, as we receive praise from Him for our delight in His life being seen and rejected by men while we are here on the earth.

This is a Greek used combination of preposition, particle, and pronoun that is used to present comparison phrases. The particles and pronouns change to show the kind of comparison and the compared groups...

βλασφημεῖται, verb ind pres pass 3rd pers sing from βλασφημέω He is being blasphemed, slandered, reviled, defamed

but on your part he is glorified. κατὰ δὲ ὑμᾶς δοξάζεται.

κατὰ δὲ ὑμᾶς prep+particle+pronoun but on your part

δοξάζεται. verb ind pres pass 3rd pers sing from δοξάζω He is being glorified, praised, honored, magnified

Literally: "on their part He is being slandered, but on your part He is being glorified"

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### The Facts of Suffering 1 Peter 4:12-14

An illustration in \*Acts 5:14 14 "And all the more believers in the Lord, multitudes of men and women, were constantly added to their number, ...<sup>17</sup> But the high priest rose up, along with all his associates (that is the sect of the Sadducees), and they were filled with jealousy. 18 They laid hands on the apostles and put them in a public jail... skipped a lot here... 27 When they had brought them, they stood them before the Council. The high priest questioned them, <sup>28</sup> saying, "We gave you strict orders not to continue teaching in this name, and yet, you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and intend to bring this man's blood upon us." 29 But Peter and the apostles answered, "We must obey God rather than men. 30 "The God of our fathers raised up Jesus, whom you had put to death by hanging Him on a cross. 31 "He is the one whom God exalted to His right hand as a Prince and a Savior, to grant repentance to Israel, and forgiveness of sins. 32 "And we are witnesses of these things; and so is the Holy Spirit, whom God has given to those who obey Him." 33 But when they heard this, they were cut to the quick and intended to kill them...skipping to v40... and after calling the apostles in, they flogged them and ordered them not to speak in the name of Jesus, and then released them. 41 So they went on their way from the presence of the Council, rejoicing that they had been considered worthy to suffer shame for His name. 42 And every day, in the temple and from house to house, they kept right on teaching and preaching Jesus as the Christ.

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### The Facts of Suffering 1 Peter 4:12-14

#### A few facts in these three verses that are for us as believers in Christ

- The term "Beloved" carries a strong message of God's view of each of us, that we are uniquely loved by Him, in His own personal, intimate way.
- God commands us to think as He thinks concerning unjust judgement of us
- > God tells us that He suffers when we suffer under unjust judgement of us
- God commands us to keep rejoicing when His new nature is seen in us
- God promises us that as we rejoice now when suffering with Him, we will joyfully, be given more of His praise when He reveals His glory to everyone
- God tells us that He the Holy Spirit is at rest upon us, when we keep rejoicing, even when misjudged because His new nature is seen in us.
- God tells us that anyone's incorrect view of His work in us insults Him, and that our correct view of His work in us honors Him

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
