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1 Corinthians 1:1-3

¹ Paul, called *as* an apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God, and Sosthenes our brother,

² To the church of God which is at Corinth, to those who have been sanctified in Christ Jesus, saints by calling, with all who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, their *Lord* and ours:

³ Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.



- ^{4a} I thank my God always concerning you (Corinthians)
- ^{4b} for the grace of God which ¹<u>was given</u> you in Christ Jesus,
- for epi on the cause of my thanksgiving being*
- lit: having been given past point fact, passive voice
- •all Corinthian believers are recipients of God's grace the moment they believe
- •this grace is in our living union with Christ



^{5a} that in everything you ²<u>were enriched</u> (made rich) in Him,

made rich – past point fact, passive voice

- •these are God's riches, not man's
- •again the riches are in Him
- ^{5b} in all speech and all knowledge,
- speech proclaiming the Word (Wuest) John 6:68

knowledge - experiential knowledge of God -Rom 11:33



⁶ even as the testimony concerning Christ ³<u>was</u> <u>confirmed</u> in you

was confirmed - lit: was proved – past point fact, passive voice

The idea is that divinely-revealed truth (about Christ) and its reality was verified (made real) among you.

⁶ inasmuch as the testimony concerning the Christ <u>was proved</u> to be divinely-revealed truth and its reality was verified among you (Wuest)

^{7a} so that (lit: with a purpose that)



- ^{7b} you (Corinthians) are not lacking in any gift (spiritual gifts),
- 1 Cor 14:12 So also you (Corinthians), since you are zealous of spiritual gifts, seek to abound for the edification of the church.
- ^{7c} awaiting eagerly the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ,
- The revealing of the Lord Jesus Christ to His saints at the Rapture would be God's greatest gift to them.*



^{8a} who ⁴<u>will</u> also <u>confirm</u> you to the end,

will confirm – will make you steadfast and constant future, indicative, active

^{8b} blameless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ.

blameless - It implies not merely acquittal, but the absence of even a charge or accusation against a person. Vine

The Corinthian Resume! (1 Cor. 1:4-9) ^{9a} God is faithful,



- This is one of the many attributes of God.
- ^{9b} through whom you ⁵<u>were called</u>
- were called elect past point fact, passive voice
- every believer in the Lord Jesus has been called
- ^{9c} into fellowship with His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

•every believer has shared in the things of Christ: His death, burial, resurrection, ascension and seating - 1 John 1:3c

The Problem of Divisions



¹⁰ Now I exhort you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you all agree and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be made complete in the same mind and in the same judgment.

¹¹ For I have been informed concerning you, my brethren, by Chloe's *people*, that there are quarrels among you.

¹² Now I mean this, that each one of you is saying, "I am of Paul," and "I of Apollos," and "I of Cephas," and "I of Christ."

Now I exhort you, brethren

exhort - parakaleō - to call to a person (para,"to the side," kaleō, "to call") Phil 4:2, Philemon 1:8-9

•An exhortation is an encouragement to make a willing choice.

•God's word is not meant to be a club to beat us into submission.

•It is rather meant to be a teacher that <u>convinces</u> us to make right choices based on the understanding of truth. McCalley ¹⁰ Now I exhort you, brethren, <u>by the name of our Lord Jesus</u> <u>Christ</u>, that you all agree and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be made complete in the same mind and in the same judgment.

by - dia - through

the name of our Lord Jesus Christ

By exhorting his readers in the name of their Lord Jesus Christ, Paul was putting what he was about to say on the highest level of authority. The Corinthians were to regard what he was about to say as coming from the Lord Himself. ¹⁰ Now I exhort you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you all agree and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be made complete in the same mind and in the same judgment.

Paul's encouragement has three parts!

1st - that you all <u>agree</u> (*lego* – say the same thing)

•*lego** never refers to mere words

- •it always refers to thoughts put into words
- •*lego* is a reflection verbally of your mentality
- •could translate *lego* as "assert" in verse 10 because assert involves content

Paul is saying I want you Corinthians to be together mentally <u>or</u> have harmony in your view point
unity was to be achieved by doctrinal agreement, <u>not</u> doctrinal compromise ¹⁰ Now I exhort you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you all agree and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be made complete in the same mind and in the same judgment.

2nd - that there be no divisions among you

divisions - *schism* - to split, tear - a schism, division, tear & so into factions – see 1 Cor. 11:18

John 7:40 --- when they* heard these words, were saying, "This certainly is the Prophet." ⁴¹ Others were saying, "This is the Christ." Still others were saying, "Surely the Christ is not going to come from Galilee, is He?" ⁴³ So a <u>division</u> occurred in the crowd because of Him.

 different opinions, wrong opinions, misapprehension of the truth ¹⁰ Now I exhort you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesushier Christ, that you all agree and that there be no divisions among you, <u>but that you be made complete in the same mind</u> and in the same judgment.

3rd - but that you be made complete

made complete - *katartizō* - repair, mend that which is broken such as the nets or broken bones in the <u>same mind</u>

Romans 12:16 Be of the <u>same mind</u> toward one another; do not be haughty in mind, but associate with the lowly. Do not be wise in your own estimation.

in the <u>same judgment</u> - denotes a consent, understanding

Philemon 1:14a But it has been my wish to do nothing about it (sending Onesimus) without first consulting you and getting your <u>consent</u>, Amp Bible

¹¹ For I have been informed concerning you, my brethren, by Chloe's *people*, that there are quarrels among you.



- For I have been informed concerning you, my brethren
- informed used of official evidence in the papyri; this evidence would hold up in court
- by Chloe's people today no one knows exactly who Chloe was
- that there are quarrels among you.

quarrels - strife - bitter discussion or words – same word used in Gal 5:20 for one of the "deeds of the flesh"

¹² Now I mean this, that each one of you is saying, "https://www. am of Paul," and "I of Apollos," and "I of Cephas," and "I of Christ."



- Now I mean this
- lit: what I mean is this
- Paul will now tell us the issue of these quarrels
- that each one of you (Corinthians)
- lit: each and everyone of you
- is saying (or asserting)
- involves the whole church

¹² Now I mean this, that each one of you is saying, "Here am of Paul," and "I of Apollos," and "I of Cephas," and "I of Christ."

apparently every Corinthian had picked his man

- "I am of Paul," (lit: I am identifying with Paul)
- and "I of Apollos,"
- and "I of Cephas,"
- and "I of Christ."

centered about their ego (I = ego – emphatic personal pronoun)

apparently centered about personality

 Paul, Apollos, Cephas (Peter) were teaching the truth about Christ

Final Thoughts



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- 1 Corinthians 3:5-7
- ⁵ What then is Apollos? And what is Paul? <u>Servants</u> through whom you believed, even as the Lord gave opportunity to each one.
- ⁶ I planted, Apollos watered, but God was causing the growth.
- ⁷ So then neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but God who causes the growth.



Mark 16:6 And he (an angel) said to them, "Do not be amazed; you are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who has been crucified. He has risen; He is not here; behold, *here is* the place where they laid Him.
