¹⁷ But in giving this instruction, I do not praise you, because you come together not for the better but for the worse.

The Corinthians had lost the sense of Christian fellowship.

¹⁸ For, in the first place, when you come together as a church, I hear that divisions exist among you; and in part, I believe it.

There were divisions (or "schisms") amongst them, which were **leading to heresies** (or "sects") being formed in the church.

¹⁹For there must also be factions among you, in order that those who are approved may have become evident among you."

- 1. The division, or schism (Gk. *schisma*), is a difference of opinion, thought and feeling existing within the assembly.
- 2. A heresy (Gk. *hairesis*) is a sect, or party, formed among the saints to maintain a particular opinion, or to follow a chosen teacher.

²⁰ "Therefore when you meet together, it is not to eat the Lord's Supper (table),

- 1. "This is not the Lord's supper; this is a debacle!"
- 2. they were invalidating the spiritual significance of the Lord's supper.

²¹ for in your eating each one takes his own supper first; and one is hungry and another is drunk.

The Lord's table is divinely intended to bring the saints together.

²²What! Do you not have houses in which to eat and drink? Or do you despise the church of God, and shame those who have nothing? What shall I say to you? Shall I praise you? In this I will not praise you."

- 1. In the first half of the verse, Paul charges that their conduct is a sin against the whole church.
- 2. Then as the word and introduces the second half of the verse, he charges that they sin against the poor as individuals.
