

Remember the question? "How are the dead raised up? and with what body do they come?"

- Christ left nothing of His material body in the tomb.
- The resurrection body will be related to the present body as the harvest is related to the seed from which it germinates—which seed must always decay.
- It is the present body that is raised, but in the sense that its identity is utterly merged into, and deposited within, the new body.
- A complete identity is assumed—that which is sown is raised.

42 So also is the resurrection of the dead. It (the body) is sown a perishable body, it is raised an imperishable body;

Sown perishable: properly to *shrivel* or *wither*, i.e. to *spoil* by any process) or to *ruin* - corrupt (self), defile, destroy.

Raised: incorruptibility; genitive unending existence; (figurative) genuineness: - immortality, incorruption,

43 it is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory; it is sown in weakness, it is raised in power;

Dishonor: infamy, indignity disgrace: dishonor, reproach, shame, vile. Reproach

- ⁴⁴ it is sown a natural body, it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual body.
- The word "natural" is from the word which the Greeks used to designate the soul of man.
- The word "spiritual" is from a word which speaks of the spirit of man.
- The resurrection body will be a spiritual body in which the spiritual life of man will predominate.

44b ''If there is a natural (or soulish) body, there is also a spiritual.''

- As surely as there is the body which we have now, suited to the earth and the life that now is.
- There is also a spiritual body, which we shall have when the Lord Christ comes to raise those that are His.

- ²⁰ For our citizenship is in heaven, from which also we eagerly wait for a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ;
- ²¹ who will transform the body of our humble state into conformity with the body of His glory, by the exertion of the power that He has even to subject all things to Himself.

⁴⁵ So also it is written, "The first MAN, Adam, BECAME A LIVING SOUL." The last Adam became a life-giving spirit.

Becoming a living soul is a result of the divine inbreathing into the earthen vessel of the breath of lives (lit., **plural**).

It is clear, however, that the immaterial part of man originates not as a creation, but as a transmission.

Scripture shows us the Lord became a quickening spirit when He rose from the dead.

46 However, the spiritual is not first, but the natural; then the spiritual.

The natural comes before the spiritual, and the first man is earthy, made out of the dust of the earth.

First is seen man failing in his responsibility; then the obedient, suffering, victorious Man.

The first Adam is, as we know, "the figure of Him that is to come."

⁴⁷ The first man is from the earth, earthy; the second man is from heaven.
