Background:

- 1. Written approximately 1 year after the 1st letter.
- 2. Paul enumerated the problems in the church (1st letter), then there arose a wave of distrust in relation to Paul himself which swept throughout the church.
- 3. Their distrust:
 - "Paul was not sincere"
 - They questioned his authority (their sin nature = "who does Paul think he is to be judging us"?)
 - Their perception: "Paul was in it for the money."
- 4. So in this wonderful letter Paul details what the life ministry of the Lord should look like through us as a vessel. This is how you recognize that the source of ministry is from the life of the Lord Jesus and not out of self.
- 5. Paul is not at all defending his life & ministry but just simply explaining how he lives (by faith) and how God then uses him as a vessel in His ministry.

<u>Theme:</u>

The character of Christ's life & ministry through a servant of God to fulfill His eternal purpose (declaring, sharing & revealing His Glory).

7. and our hope for you is firmly grounded, knowing that as you are sharers of our sufferings, so also you are *sharers* of our comfort.

- The Major Theme in This Section Is <u>"Comfort"</u>
 - Observe the usage :
 - "Comfort" as a noun, 6 times (1:3; 1:4; 1:5; 1:6; 1:6, 1:7)
 - "Comfort" as a verb , 4 times (1:4; 1:4; 1:4; 1:6)
 - What Does "Comfort" Mean?
 - "Comfort" as a <u>verb</u> from *parañ*, to the side of, and *kaleô*, to call. Hence, to console (to solace, to set at rest), to comfort
 - "Comfort" as a <u>noun</u> a consolation (a solace, a setting at rest), a comfort, an exhortation
- God is "the God of all comfort" 1:3
 - He is the only source of true comfort.
 - There is no one but God that can set our hearts at rest & truly comfort us.


• Why Do We Need God's Comfort ?

Principle:

Affliction provides opportunity for us to learn more of our Father in His mercy, as well as providing a deeper understanding of what others may be called upon to go through.

The Lord deals with us in order that we might be able to minister in an apt way. TA-S NBHH

God's comfort is never absent from any one of our afflictions.

God's comfort is present in every one of our afflictions.

God's comfort or setting our hearts at rest is not only for our personal relief but for us to identify & minister to others.

Just think, your affliction may be God's preparation for you to minister to others.

"Suffering" - (pathēma.), physical and/or mental pain or distress

- This is our suffering for His sake & glory, it's the fellowship of His suffering. Phil 3:10; 1 Pet 4:13
- When we suffer- Christ suffers with us, because of our identification with Him.

God's principle of abundance (of having more than enough)

- As our suffering abounds, God's comfort super-abounds.
- Where the sin (nature) abounds, God's grace super-abounds. (Rom 5:20) Molloy

Philippians 1:29 (NKJV) ²⁹ For to you it has been granted on behalf of Christ, not only to believe in Him, but also to suffer for His sake.

The Father prepares His sufferers, by means of their sufferings.

"The gracious <u>gift of suffering</u> is as distinct and specific a gift as any other of God's gifts. But this gift transforms the blessed recipient more surely perhaps than all the others into resemblance to Himself, and is for this fellowship, the highest, greatest, noblest of them all." ⁶ But if we are afflicted, it is for your comfort and salvation; or if we are comforted, it is for your comfort, which is effective in the patient enduring of the same sufferings which we also suffer;


