- 12 Now when I came to Troas for the gospel of Christ and when a door was opened for me in the Lord,
 - 13 I had no rest for my spirit, not finding Titus my brother; but taking my leave of them, I went on to Macedonia.

We see two things here:

- 1. Paul's deep-seated desire for the spread of the gospel;
- 2. And his still deeper-seated need for the saints who were in danger of compromising Christ.
- Though an **open door** was set before him by the Lord he was unable to benefit from it, due to his great anxiety for news of the Corinthians.
- In this case his pastoral devotion prevailed against his evangelistic fervor.

Now when I came to Troas for the gospel of Christ and when a door was opened for me in the Lord,

13 I had no rest for my spirit, not finding Titus my brother; but taking my leave of them, I went on to Macedonia.

QUESTION, how does one decide which way to go?

- The only way to obtain guidance in work is by living close to the Lord.
- The Lord will send it by laying it on one's heart to go.
- In the absence of guidance, do nothing, but be a testimony where you are.
- If your eye is single, your whole body will be full of light.
- We get right impressions by living with Christ.
- You must live near the Lord, or you cannot reckon rightly on being guided.

- 1. He is always leading us in triumph in Christ.

Question: What does it take to be triumphant?

- "leading in triumph" (thriambeuō) The focus is on the <u>display</u> of glory of the conquerors after the victor.
- We are in Christ, our leader, who has triumphed over all enemies.
 Col 2:15
- We are super conquerors through Christ.
 Rom 8:37
- Christ is displaying His glory through us to principalities & powers in heavenly places (i.e. revealing His glory).
- Christ is displaying His glory through us to the world (i.e. revealing His glory).

Question: Do believers still have enemies?

Who is enemy #1 in your life?

- We can thank God that Christ has conquered all our enemies!
- He has conquered all principalities & powers.
 Col 2:15
- He has conquered enemy #1 (our enemy within) = our sin nature

- Rom 6:6,10; Gal 2:20

- 2 Cor. 3:1-18

For we are a fragrance of Christ to God among those who are being saved and among those who are perishing;

Question: How does God fulfill His eternal purpose of revealing His glory to mankind?

- Through believers who are a sweet savor or fragrance of the knowledge & glory of Christ to 3 parties:
 - 1. "to God" The glory of Christ being manifested through us (2 Cor. 3:1-18) is very pleasant to God but not necessarily to men (unbelievers & believers).
 - "among those who are being saved"
 - Question: What are these believers being saved or delivered (present, passive) from?
 - Is not God (passive voice) delivering us (present tense = moment by moment) from all the difficult circumstances previously mentioned:
 - Tribulation / affliction, being afflicted, suffering, being pressed, burdened & in despair - 2 Cor. 1:4-10
 - 3. "among those who are perishing" 2 Cor. 2:15
- God divides all mankind into 2 groups 1 Cor. 1:18
 - "Those being saved" &
 - "Those perishing" (not extinction but loss of well being for all eternity)

Question: What is meant by the expressions "death unto death" & "life unto life"?

- Those perishing & those being saved fall under God's operating principles :
 - "The principle of sin & death" for those who are perishing

- Rom 8:2

"The principle of life" - for those who are being saved

- Rom 8:2
- <u>"death"</u> (principle of death /separation in Adam) <u>unto "death"</u> (separation from God now and for all eternity)
 Rom 8:2; Rom 5:12,18
- "life" (principle of life in Christ) unto "life" (Christ's life now & for all eternity)
- Rom 8:2; Col 3:4
- Note: Joseph was a savor of death to the baker & a savor of life to the butler Gen 40

Question: Do you & I have the sufficiency to be this aroma of Christ?

(This question is answered in 2 Cor 3:5)

¹⁶ to the one an aroma from death to death, to the other an aroma from life to life. And who is adequate for these things?

No wonder the question is raised. It is raised, but, not answered immediately.

It is answered however in verse 5 of the next chapter.

Because the whole point being of God there is no sufficiency but of God.

Note: There are different Greek words & translations for the words "savor"(KJV) & "aroma / fragrance"(NAS)

- 2:14 osmēn a smell, odor, or fragrance of any kind, it can be good or bad - KJV = 'savor' - NAS = 'sweet aroma'
- 2:15 euōdia a good smell, odor, or fragrance - KJV = 'sweet savor' - NAS = 'fragrance'
- 2:16 osmēn (2X) a smell, odor, or fragrance of any kind, it can be good or bad -KJV = `savor'(2X) -NAS = `aroma'(2X)


