#1 contrast of the all and the one.

Under law one man radiated God's glory but under the new gospel all radiate God's glory with unveiled face.

#2 Contrast of clarity. OT types and shadows, abstract. Under the NT it is unveiled face, no obstruction for any believer.

#3 Contrast between the transforming glory. The NT ministry and the fading glory. **No one was changed by looking into Moses' face.**We see the glory of Jesus Christ and **we are changed into that glory**.

#4 Contrast between the means. The Spirit and the letter. We live the Christian life by the Spirit not by the law.

The word *transfigure* (metamorphoumetha) is used **four times** in the New Testament (cf. Matt. 17:2; Mark 9:2; Rom. 12:2; 2 Cor. 3:18), and conveys a meaning which is peculiar and distinctive when contrasted with (metaschematizetai), translated *transforming* or *transformed*.

- A thing is transformed by influences from without, while a thing is transfigured by the outshining of a light or vitality which is resident within.
- The believer is subject to transfiguration and not to mere transformation.
