To know by perception, to be aware (PARTICIPLE IN ACTIVE VOICE, 1<sup>ST</sup> Person) We know now

What do we know?

He. The Father. The One having raised the Son. He will also raise us up to be with Jesus

#### What else do we know?

"to place beside" "to stand beside" Indicative, future, active

The Father will cause both us and you to stand in His own presence with Jesus.

God's power would unite Paul with his fellow believers whom God would also resurrect

# What will be our acceptability to God be then?

Ephesians 5:27 (NASB) <sup>27</sup> that He might present (same word) to Himself the church in all her glory, having no spot or wrinkle or any such thing; but that she would be holy and blameless.

Colossians 1:22 (NASB) <sup>22</sup> yet He has now reconciled you in His fleshly body through death, in order to present you before Him holy and blameless and beyond reproach—

### 1 Thessalonians 4:14 (NASB)

<sup>14</sup> For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so God will bring with Him those who have fallen asleep in Jesus.

"As God's grace expanded in their hearts and through them reached ever-increasing numbers, so too, the volume of thanksgiving to God for the receipt of illumination would increase and promote the glory of God." (cf. 4:6)

### 2 Corinthians 4:6 (NASB)

<sup>6</sup> For God, who said, "Light shall shine out of darkness," is the One who has shone in our hearts to give the Light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ.

#### How Should we look at trials?

<sup>15</sup>"For all things are for your sakes, that the abundant grace might through the thanksgiving of many redound to the glory of God".

- 1. Since He is **both** my God and my Father, and
- 2. Since all of the hardships He takes me through are specifically designed to conform me to the image of the Lord Jesus,

How can I help but trust Him and rejoice in His faithfulness?

"It is well to remember that the deepest and truest spiritual qualities are **not** learned or established in us by our happy or enjoyable times, but in the difficult ones! In the securing of Christ in greater measure in our lives, we find that it is by the things which we suffer that we learn most.

"The one purpose which our Father has in view, in all His ways, is to conform us to the image of His Son.

#### The chief concern of our Lord is

- Not to instruct us about a multitude of details,
- Not to explain to us the reason for the trials which we are called to pass through.
- He is working out everything to serve His supreme purpose in displaying the character of His Son in His redeemed ones."
