





I Thessalonians chapter 1: 8-10

Today's passage:

8 For the word of the Lord has sounded forth from you, not only in Macedonia and Achaia, but also in every place your faith toward God has gone forth, so that we have no need to say anything.

<u>9</u> For they themselves report about us what kind of a reception we had with you, and how you turned to God from idols to serve a living and true God,

<u>10</u> and to wait for His Son from heaven, whom He raised from the dead, *that is* Jesus, who rescues us from the wrath to come.



I Thessalonians 8-10

Main Purpose of the Epistle: Paul Must Clear Up

1) The issue with the Thessalonians:

- a) Work of Faith: excellent
- b) Labor of Love: excellent
- C) Steadfastness/patience in Hope: they needed some shoring up on this

2) The issue: The Thessalonicans knew from Paul's teaching that the Lord's return (appearing-*Parousia*) is imminent . . . However . . . They had some concerns:

a) What about Aunt June/ Uncle Marvin/ and John Q. Public, who have died within the last year and a half? They will miss the rapture? What is their eternal fate? What becomes of them?

b) Paul needed to clear up their thoughts on their blessed hope [JN Darby: Snopsis]

I Thessalonians 8-10

The Tenor of this Epistle:

1) Personable, Warm

a)

- Paul warmly opens his heart to the Thessalonian believers, overflowingly, in kindred tones tones. (Wm Kelly)
- b) He is happy/refreshed at Timothy's status report on the condition of the assembly at Thessalonica; Paul's joy bursts forth in remembrance of them, in constant thanksgiving to God for their stability and growth. Alas his short labors were not in vain in Thessalonica.
- C) The brevity of Paul's ministry there: He was in their presence three Saturdays, likely less than a month. Some others say up to 6 weeks.
- d) Note: how Paul does address them from his apostolic title. . . The Thessalonians never had any doubts he was directly from the Lord.
- 2) The Doctrinal topics covered by Paul to this new church (Paul writing approx. 1 ½ years later):

a) Election (1:4); b) the Holy Spirit (1:5-6; 4:8; 5:19). c) Conversion (turning away/to) (1:9);
d) Assurance of salvation (1:5); e) Sanctification (4:3, 5:23); f) general Christian life

teachings.

The coverage was thin with great gaps, but Paul covered it.



1) The word of the Lord sounded forth from you . . .

- a) Sounded = exec-heō. Out from sound. (Constable) picture: an echo that rings out indefinitely. Unmistakable proclamation
- b) Macedonia: the Greek region that Thessalonica is the principal city
- c) Achaia: the region to the south that had Corinth as its principal city
- d) Hampden-Keathley wonders if
 accounts of the Thessalonican conversion
 & Godly conduct didn't reach Priscilla &
 Aquila (Akylas) in Rome before they ended
 up meeting with Paul in Corinth

2) The news of the Thessalonican change in manner of life was reverberating throughout these two regions . . .

a) 'People were talking everywhere along The Egnatian way, and down south to Achaia that a body of people- *(former idol worshippers)*- would abandon their false Gods, and be filled with the knowledge of the one true God in a joy which no sufferings could chill' [Wm. Kelly]

3) From this active center of commerce the report peeled forth everywhere...

a) '...of a Macedonian assembly (the church at Thessalonika) that renounced Zeus, Hera, Artemis, Apollo and All the rest, *without adopting* the cold, hard legalism and circumcision of the Jews.' (WM. Kelly)





<u>9</u> For they themselves report about us what kind of a reception we had with you, and how you turned to God from idols to serve a living and true God,

1) Receiving Paul

- a) <u>Receiving</u> = **eisodos** = exact opposite of exodus. (the way in vs. the way out)
- b) or: Paul's entrance into Thessalonica
- c) We will look more into Paul's reception in next week's (Chap. 2:1-4) lesson

2) Turning to God from idols....

- a) Turning = epistrephō = convert = conversion = to turn to; to return to; turn around. A salvation term:
 "Therefore repent and return, so that your sins may be wiped away, in order that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord" PETER TO CROWD AT LAME BEGGAR'S HEALING' ACTS 3
- b) Compare epistrephō (conversion; turning around) to: repenting = *metanoeō* = a change of mind

<u>9</u> For they themselves report about us what kind of a reception we had with you, and how you turned to God from idols to serve a living and true God,

3) Turning around to God from idols, cont . . .

- a) Some of the idols of the time: Artemis, Apollo, Nike, Tyche, Aphrodite, Demeter, Kore, Hercules, Poseidon, Zeus, Helios (the Sun), Asklepios, Pan, Dionysos, Hera, Hades, Hermes
- b) The church at Thessalonica was comprised of prominent women (similar to Lydia of Phillipi) of the city and Gentile God-fearers, (attracted to the God of the Jews) & Gentile idolators. (The Jews here seemed to reject Paul; unlike in Berea where they were receptive.). Many times slaves were the converts of Paul.

4) Only God (Yahweh, Jehovah, the Lord Jesus Christ) is a living God

- a) "Men, why are you doing these things? We are also men of the same nature as you, and preach the gospel to you that you should <u>turn</u> from these [<u>Zeus & Hermes</u>] vain things to a living God, WHO MADE THE HEAVEN AND THE EARTH AND THE SEA AND ALL THAT IS IN THEM. Acts 14:15
- b) Idols are things: created works of man's hands (& minds), made of silver, gold, stone, wood. Scripture repeated emphasizes this: (Ps: 115:4; 135:15; Is: 2:8,20; 31:7; 42:17, etc.)

) The 2 infinitives: to Serve (vs. 9) and to Wait (vs. 10)

- a) The Thess. Believers turned (vs. 9) God-ward for the result/purpose of: 1.
 Serving & 2. Waiting [two present active infinitives]
- b) Our application for today: we too are serve and "(For our citizenship is in heaven) from which also we eagerly wait for a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ;" [Phil. 3:20]
- c) We serve, and are to continue on serving in the future. And we wait, and are to continue on waiting into the future is the thrust of the grammer in vs. 9 &10
- d) In II Thess. Epistle: Paul had to address some in the assembly taking 'waiting' to an extreme- quitting their jobs and not being productive.
- e) We <u>now</u> are to wait "looking for the blessed hope and the appearing/ epiphane-ia of the glory of our great God and Savior, Christ Jesus;" [Titus 2:13]

- Verse 10 is really the crux of the I Thessalonian letter: the Coming of the Lord Jesus Christ (*Parousia*). Here is why:
 - a) EVERY CHAPTER in I Thes. Has mention of the future coming of Jesus Christ. They are described as: those who: i. *"wait for his Son from Heaven"* 1:10; ii. They will be the joy & crown of Paul's gospel ministry *at the coming of the Lord* (2:19); iii. their ultimate sanctification is promised *when Christ comes* (3:13). [WALVOORD, OP. CIT. SLIDE 4]
 - **b) Parousia** to be near; alongside; the presence of a person physically.
 - c) Compare <u>Parousia</u> to other words used to describe Christ's coming for His saints & with His saints:
 - *i. apokalupsis* (revealing/revelation, uncovering, unveiling); and
 - *ii. Epiphaneia* (to bring forth into the light; to shine; show forth)

3) Some Examples of Christ's coming / appearance / revelation:

- a) "... but to the degree that you share the sufferings of Christ, keep on rejoicing, so that also at the revelation (apokalupsis) of His glory you may rejoice with exultation." [I PET 4:13]
- b) "... and then shall that Wicked (lawless one) be revealed (apokalyptō), whom the Lord shall consume with the spirit/ breath(NAS) of his mouth, and shall destroy with the brightness(KJ)/appearance (ephiphaneia) of his coming (parousia): [II THES. 2:8]

4) What are the Characteristics of the Rapture?:

- a) It's fast: in a twinkling of an eye, in a moment
- b) Who: the body of believers (both living and sleeping) in the death, burial & resurrection of Jesus Christ who have trusted Christ's Work for their personal salvation. (The Church).
- c) What: *harpazo*: a catching away; up; snatching, plucking from earth
- d) Where: in the clouds; the 1st heaven; the Troposphere (up to 20 mi. above the surface of the earth) at some elevation; the Lord will catch us up there to meet him
- e) When: at any moment from now; it's imminent; it's 'overhanging' like an icycle about to fall: like a thief in the night [I Thes 5:2]; no one knows the day or the hour [Mat. 24]; quickly [Rev 22:20]
- f) No pre-Signs; no warning
- g) Destination: heaven; with 'shall always be with' Him physically from then on.
- h) Purpose: To be with Him forever; be given our reward; fulfilment of the blessed hope; be given the third and final piece of salvation: release from the Sin Nature, from the body of death to new heavenly bodies. Salvation from the presence of sin.
- i) Purpose of Verse 10 above: is deliverance/salvation from the wrath & Day of the Lord to come. (We are not under its pervue/ appointed to it). [I Thes. 5:9]
