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1 John 1:3-4 – Reality of the Incarnation Part 2

* ¹ That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked upon, and our hands have handled, of the Word of life;

² (For the life was manifested, and we have seen *it*, and bear witness, and shew unto you that eternal life, which was with the Father, and was manifested unto us;)

³ That which we have seen and heard declare we unto you, that ye also may have fellowship with us: and truly our fellowship *is* with the Father, and with his Son Jesus Christ.

⁴ And these things write we unto you, that your joy may be full.

ľvα [conj ľvα] used to introduce purpose or goal *that, in order that, so that* καὶ [conj, καí] and, also, even ὑμεῖς [pers pro nom 2p pl σύ] you κοινωνίαν [n acc fem s κοινωνία] fellowship, Danker: close association in shared interest' or 'shared community life' ἕχητε [v subj pres act 2p pl ἕχω] may be having, *keep, possess* μεθ' [prep gen μετά] in fellowship and contact with, associated with, John emphasizes that God is Jesus and that He is *with* his disciples (3:2; 8:29; 13:33; 14:9, 16; 16:4, 32; 17:12). *** ³ That which we have seen with discernment and at present is in our mind's eye, and that which we have heard and at present is ringing in our ears, we are reporting also to you, in order that as for you also, you may participate jointly in common with us. And the fellowship indeed which is ours, is with the Father and with His Son, Jesus Christ. ⁴ And these things, as for us, we are writing in order that our joy, having been filled completely full in times past, may persist in that state of fulness through the present time.

A bit of review to stir up our minds by remembrance

John wrote 5 of the books in the New Testament Scriptures, The Gospel of John, 1-3 John, and The Revelation or Jesus Christ.

John's Gospel is about Our past Salvation John's Letters are about Our present Sanctification John's Revelation is about Our future Sharing His Glory

> 1 John takes us as God's children into His family and His fellowship

Paul takes us as united with Him Positionally complete, and a Condition of growing into His likeness as members of His Church

A bit more of review to stir up our minds by remembrance

> Both the Gospel of John and 1 John have clear stated purposes

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John 20:30 "...that you might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you might have life thru His Name"

the Words & Works of Jesus that prove His Deity

1 John 5:13 "...that ye may know that ye have eternal life, and that ye may believe on the name of the Son of God"

the Words & Works that ought to follow those who have believed



There is more... 1 John 5:13 is the 7th stated purpose

1 John 1:3 "...that you also may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father, and with His Son Jesus Christ." Fellowship with believers and our Father and His Son is God's purpose here

1 John 1:4 "...that our joy may be made complete." Our Joy being made complete is God's purpose here

1 John 2:1 "...that you may not sin."

Our not sinning is God's purpose here

1 John 2:13-17 "...to fathers, young men, and children ... because he that does the will of God abides forever."

Our victory over all by resting in Him is God's purpose here

1 John 2:21-24 "... If what you heard from the beginning abides in you, you also will abide in the Son and in the Father."

Our personal being at home in the Son and in the Father is God's purpose here

1 John 2:26 "...concerning those who are trying to deceive you."

Our being warned of deceivers is God's purpose here



Some observations

about 3 more Heptadic (groups of 7) structures in 1 John

There are seven traits of the Born Again 1 John 1:29, 3:9, 4:7, 5:1(x2), 5:4. 5:18

There are seven tests of Christian genuineness 1 John 1:6, 1:8, 1:10, 2:4, 2:6, 2:9, 4:20

There are seven tests of honesty and reality 1 John 1:6, 1:8, 1:10, 2:4, 2:6, 2:9, 4:20

And there are 6 references about liars here 1 John 1:6, 1:10, 2:4, 2:22, 4:20, 5:10



John was used to reveal these things of God Salvation, Sanctification, & Sharing His Glory, He creates us, He lives in us, His Glory is seen through us, and His Glory will forever be praised.

So... What are God's things revealed in these 2 verses?

The focus is on

Fellowship and Joy

Notice the way God communicates He proclaims in writing



Fellowship and Joy

Fellowship is in Greek, koinonia, and means: Fellowship, a close <u>mutual relationship</u>, partnership, communion In 1 John this is a sharing relationship in God's family

Fellowship in God's family is two-dimensional:

--Horizontal: fellowship with one another of the same kind, brethren --Vertical: with our Father and with His Son Jesus Christ

There are two families in this world. Jesus said to the pharisees "you are of your father the devil" John 8:44

You can not "join" God's family, you must be born into it "unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." Jn 3:3 We hear Him through His Word, He hears us through our prayers "Thy words were found, and I did eat them, and thy word was unto me the joy and rejoicing of mine heart... " Jer 15:16

Fellowship and Joy

³ what we have seen and heard <u>we proclaim to you</u> also, that you also may have **fellowship** with us; and indeed our **fellowship** is with the Father, and with His Son Jesus Christ.

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Joy is in Greek, kara, and means: delight, pleasure, joy, satisfaction

God's gift of His joy is that settled state of our new heart being totally delighted and satisfied in God and His family

This is produced by God the Spirit as part of His "fruit" in every believer.

"the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law." Gal 5:22-23 "make my joy complete by being of the same mind, maintaining the same love, united in spirit, intent on one purpose." Phil 2:2 "For you are our glory and joy" 1 Th 2:20

Fellowship and Joy

⁴ And these things <u>we write</u>, so that our joy may be made complete.

- Jesus promised His joy would come to us with the Holy Spirit... "These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may be in you, and that your joy may be made full." Jn 15:11
- Jesus made this promise in the context of His command to love one another with His kind of love...

"This is My commandment, that you love one another, just as I have loved you." John 15:12

Jesus had knowledge of this great joy as He endured the cross to satisfy the offence of our sin, and to show us how much God loves us

"fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God." Heb 12:2
