- \* <sup>1</sup> What was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we beheld and our hands handled, concerning the Word of Life
- <sup>2</sup> --and the life was manifested, and we have seen and bear witness and proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and was manifested to us--

αὐτὸς [pro pers nom masc s αὐτός] He Himself, intense emphasis on person's essence  $i\lambda\alpha\sigma\mu$ ός [n nom masc s  $i\lambda\alpha\sigma\mu$ ός] propitiation, expiation, satisfaction for sin. Jesus Himself offered Himself on the cross as the perfect sin offering, taking our sin punishment. This is God's means to overcome the broken relationship between God and sinful man, and God is now free to bless those who trust that His punishment was full payment for their own sins. He is both offeror priest and offering sacrifice

### A bit of overview to stir up our minds by remembrance

➤ John wrote 5 of the books in the New Testament Scriptures, The Gospel of John, 1-3 John, and The Revelation of Jesus Christ.

John's Gospel is about Christ revealing His Glory to us
Our past
Salvation to believe
John's Letters are about Christ sharing His Glory with us
Our present
Sanctification of harmony & joy
Revelation is about Christ's Glory being recognized & honored
Our future
Sharing His Glory & praising Him

- > John presents Christ as God's way of entering into His new family
- > 1 John presents God's children as His new family in harmony & joy
- > Revelation presents Christ's absolute Glory recognized & honored
- > Paul's writing presents Christ's new creation, identified as His body, positionally complete, and conditionally growing into His likeness



### Some observations from 1 John 1:1-4

- <sup>3</sup> what we have seen and heard <u>we proclaim</u> to you also, **that you also may have fellowship with us; and indeed our <u>fellowship</u> is with the Father, and with His Son Jesus Christ.**
- <sup>4</sup> And these things we write, so that our joy may be made complete.

When? The time of the incarnation of Jesus Christ, God taking human form Who? Jesus Christ, God's Son is God's perfect human expression of Himself What? Things about this Glorious One who was eternally existing with God the Father and came as God in human flesh to reveal God's love for man

How? By pouring out His own perfect human life blood unto death to bear the penalty of man's sin and to enable the washing away of man's sin.

Why? So God could offer man His eternal harmony and joy

This is God's Grace

God's absolute message? God is light without darkness of any kind

Some possibilities and consequences that are for believers alone

That we can be in harmony with both God & darkness is a lie & this is not reality
When we are at home in His light & His love we are purified from sin is reality
That we are now perfect is self-deception & this is not reality
When we agree with God about our sins He forgives & washes all sins is reality
When we disagree with God about our sins, we call God a liar & this is not reality

This is God's Truth



### Some observations from 1 John chapter 1

- 1 John (all of it) presents God's children as His new family in harmony & joy
- > John assumes that the believers he is writing to will remember this personal introduction about God through Christ giving us, out of His love, participation in His full harmony and joy, as the foundation of all he is about to present.
- ➤ Understanding this style of writing in shorthand of stated and assumed to be remembered truth, is very important to understand statements made in the remaining parts of this letter about us, as members of God's unique family.
- Many followers of those who teach this book as being a book of "tests" for a person coming to know if they are saved or lost are confused, along with their teachers, because they have not observed that this book is for believers, to give us assurance that God is the One Who saves, holds, and cleans every one of us, in His "new in kind" family of Church age believers.
- > Please check out what I am presenting by the text of scripture alone, not based on what may be favorite personal assumptions, but God's reality.
- ➤ The booklet of Dennis M. Rokser titled "How to Interpret 1 John", available on line from Grace Gospel Press on Amazon, I believe clearly explains God's message in 1 John from the text and context of Scripture alone.



#### Some observations from 1 John 2:1-2

- \* 1 John 2:1 My little children, I am writing these things to you that you may not sin. And if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; <sup>2</sup> and He Himself is the propitiation for our sins; and not for ours only, but also for those of the whole world.
- Notice the shift from "we" to "my" and "l" in the text, it is very personal. John knows who he is writing to are born, by God's doing, into His unique family upon believing the message John has delivered to them of God's love.
- ▶ John calls the recipients his little children, and repeats this in 2:12, 28; 3:7, 18; 4:4; 5:21. This he copies from Jesus as seen in Jn 13:33.
- > The teaching is that believers are not authorized to sin. This message from God thru John is to tell believers that God does not want believers to sin
- God knows His children do commit acts of sin, so God provided His Son to stand, instead of us, face to face with His Father, in harmony with Him that His death is legal payment in full for all our sins
- God the Son Himself, has removed sin, the barrier between us and God, by becoming both the offeror priest and the offering sacrifice, for not just our sin as believers, but also for the mass of sin of the whole world



#### More observations from 1 John 2:1-2

- \* 1 John 2:1 My little children, I am writing these things to you that you may not sin. And if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; <sup>2</sup> and He Himself is the propitiation for our sins; and not for ours only, but also for those of the whole world.
- Since God the Son Himself, has removed sin, the barrier between us and God, the issue now for harmony between us and God is, do we believe God has done this for us?
- ➤ All of the following information in 1 John is based upon the truths presented up to this point in 1 John. Please keep this observation in mind as you read and observe God's message in the rest of this letter.
- John wrote expecting those believers who would receive his letter would remember the foundational truths given in the beginning, and automatically supply it to correctly understand what he says in the rest of this letter.

God gave through John's writings these things about His Son & His new family; He has created us, He now lives in us, His Glory is revealed through us, and His Glory will forever be praised.
