

- ¹ Paul,
 - a bond-servant [doulos] of Christ Jesus,
 - called as an apostle [sent one]
 - set apart [to separate] for the gospel of God,
- ² which = the gospel of God
 - He promised beforehand <u>through</u> His prophets
 - in the holy Scriptures, [Who has believed our message*]
 - ³ <u>concerning</u> [surrounding] His Son,
 - who was born [became flesh] of a descendant of David according to the flesh,
 - ⁴ who <u>was declared</u> [to mark out] the Son of God with power by the resurrection from the dead,
 - according to the Spirit of holiness, Jesus Christ our Lord, [this is the spirit of Christ]

The core of the Gospel [good news]

1 Cor 15:1 Now I make known to you, brethren, the gospel which I preached to you, which also you received, in which also you stand, ^{2b} by which also you are saved,

1 Cor 15:3 For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures,⁴ and that He was buried, and that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures.

- Christ died for our sins (on behalf of our sins) our substitute.
- Christ was buried you only bury a dead man.
- Christ was raised God raised Him up again, --- since it was impossible for Him to be held in its power.

Blessings of Who We Are In Christ*

- We received grace and apostleship (Paul only)
- We are called (elected) <u>ones</u>
- We are beloved of God
- We are called <u>saints</u>
- Grace and peace is continuously supplied

- ⁵ through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about *the* obedience of faith among all the Gentiles for His name's sake,
 - through whom ["the Son of God" from verse 4]
 - God the Father is the source
 - Jesus Christ is His instrument
 - we have received
 - This is a factual event that happened in time past (aorist, indicative, active)


grace - charis - is God's unmerited favor

- A gift bestowed on all believers Eph 2:8
- We have perpetual access into His grace by faith *
- We stand (are entrenched) in His grace our eternal position*

and – has the force of "and in particular"

Molloy

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 Rom 15:15b because of <u>the grace that was given me</u> from God, ¹⁶ to be a minister of Christ Jesus to the Gentiles, ministering as a priest the gospel of God, so that my offering of the Gentiles may become acceptable ---

apostleship – lit: a sending, a mission

- Personal grace must come before true service.
- The grace Paul had received concerned both his personal salvation and his service as the great example of divine favor. Newell

to bring about - eis - in order that there may be Wuest NT

eis - a preposition often speaking of purpose or result, here used in the sense of the words "in order to bring about."

the obedience of faith

obedience - hypakoē - is "a listening under" to the Lord via the Word*


- Obedience proceeds out from faith as a direct result or fruit (genitive of source)*
- Chronologically and logically faith comes first, then obedience or yielding* * Molloy

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⁵ through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about *the* obedience of faith <u>among</u> <u>all the Gentiles for His name's sake</u>,



- 2nd for [on behalf of] His name's sake
- God is glorified as we listen under His word



* Believers have received God's grace and Paul received grace & apostleship

⁶ among whom you also are the called of Jesus Christ;

among whom

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you are - eimi - the state in which someone continually exist

- present tense, continuous action
- This is a positional truth which applies to all believers the called is literally the "called ones" called ones - *klētos* - an invitation, a call, an appointment
- This is an adjective that describes who we are in Christ of Jesus Christ
- He is the source of our being a "called one" Molloy

Verse 6 ends Paul's introduction to the Roman church.



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
Key point about the "called ones"*

- Called or appointed ones it does not depend on
 human acceptance or rejection
- Called ones are only those called (or elected) by God who are in Christ
- Called ones <u>never</u> refer to unbelievers
- We were called before the foundation of the world Eph 1:3,4
- God's calling is fulfilling His eternal purpose in us sharing His glory Rom 9:23-24

^{7a} to all who are beloved of God in Rome, called as saints

Paul now gives us the <u>addressee</u> and describes who they are in Christ – Why?

Interlinear:

to all the ones being in Rome, loved ones of God,

called ones, saints

- Even though the letter is addressed to "the ones in Rome" it applies to all believers in Christ
- These two attributes are true of all believers
 - [being] loved ones of God (i.e. beloved)
 - being eimi the state in which someone continually exists
 - called ones [to be] saints

^{7a} to all who are beloved of God in Rome, called as saints

 1st - [being] loved ones of God
 beloved - agapetos – this is the adjective form of agapao; describes a tender and intimate relationship

Important points:

Molloy

- This is how the Father refers to His Son Matt 3:17
- God has the same tender and intimate relationship with us (because we are in Christ)
- We can rejoice and rest in His intimate love for us
- Only His children are His "beloved"
- Unbelievers are loved by God, but are not His "beloved"
 John 3:16
- Nothing can separate <u>us</u> from being His "beloved"

Rom 8:35

^{7a} to all who are beloved of God in Rome, <u>called as saints</u>

- 2nd called [to be] saints
- called klētos a calling or appointment
- saints hagios one who is set apart; in the plural, as used of believers, it designates all such and is not applied merely to persons of exceptional holiness

more on called saints:

Molloy

Every believer is called or appointed by God as a saint

2 Thes 1:10, Eph 5:27

- Every believer is set apart to God by God
- Sainthood is not an attainment
- Sainthood is the position into which God calls every

believer

1 Cor 1:2

Believers living in sin are still saints

^{7b} [greeting] Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.



Now, Paul gives his greeting to the church:

- Grace & peace is to church at Rome and to all believers
 <u>Important points</u>:
 Molloy
- The only source of grace & peace is from the Father
 and the Son
 1 Cor 1:3; Gal 1:3
- Grace & peace is God's constant supply to you 2 Cor 9:8
- God desires that we walk in His grace & peace Col 2:6
- God abundantly supplies His grace & peace to us for His glory
 2 Cor 4:15
- God's abundant peace guards our hearts and minds

Final Thoughts*



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- The salutation [verses 1 to 7] reveals the germ ideas that the writer proceeded to develop later.
- This feature is also characteristic of Paul's other epistles.
- So far Paul said he had a message [the gospel] that
 - was in harmony with the Old Testament.
 - It was from the risen Christ.
 - It was for all people [*ethnos*]
 - Furthermore it should lead people to obey [listen under] God by exercising faith in Him.


