

# Rom 8:14-15 The Holy Spirit's Leading and Witnessing


<sup>12</sup> So then, brethren, we are under obligation, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh—

- brethren [members of the same family, fellowship of life]




<sup>13</sup> for if you are living according to the flesh, you must die; but if by the Spirit you are putting to death the deeds of the body, you will live.

#### by the Spirit of God

- <u>no</u> command to be led of the Spirit in New Testament\*
- apart from this ministry [Holy Spirit's] none can follow the path of God's own choosing\*
- not every saved person is led of the Spirit\* \*Chafer
- Next, what can we say about those who are led

<sup>14</sup> For all who are being led by the Spirit of God,

these are sons of God. called the brethren in v:12

these [the ones being led] are sons of God

are – eimi – the state in which someone continually exists (present tense)

sons – huios - those whom God loves and cherishes as a father [believers – men and women]

- That is, by the leading of the Spirit they are proved to be mature sons of God.\*
- In the verses to come a distinction is drawn between the child of God [*teknon*] and the mature son [*huios*].\*
- The implication being that not all Christians, though uniformly children of God, are manifesting the characteristics of those who have grown to maturity.\*

for - gar - indeed

you have <u>not</u> received – this is the negative of *lambanō* – to receive what is given or imparted (aorist tense)

a spirit – refers to a disposition or attitude (e.g. the spirit of that man is wonderful) Wuest

of slavery - douleia – as of being a slave or in bondage

- lit: you have not received a disposition or attitude of slavery
- You cannot receive evil things from God!

leading to fear again

leading to - eis - with [the] resulting

fear - the fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge\*

again – *palin* – this has occurred before (before salvation) examples:

- Of that fallen condition of man himself which makes him dread God Vine
- Heb 2:15 and [He Christ] might free those who through fear of death were subject to slavery all their lives.

but – alla – strong contrast

you have received – *lambanō* - to receive what is given or imparted (aorist tense)

- so this is an event in every believer's life at the moment of salvation
- first we had the negative [spirit of slavery], now we are given the positive work of the Spirit

a spirit – in context "the Spirit"

of adoption as sons - *huiothesia* - from *huios*, "a son," and *thesis*, "a placing," lit: a son placing

the Spirit has made us sons [huios] Merryman

more on a spirit of adoption as sons:\*

- In the Roman family all children were looked upon as teknon
- There came a time when a father legally acknowledged his son to be his heir
- It was a public announcement where the son was given all legal rights to his father's inheritance
- adoption as sons in the New testament:
- It is the Holy Spirit who places the children of God into a legal standing before God as adult sons [*huios*]
- This means with all the legal rights of an heir
- But this is not realized until the 2<sup>nd</sup> advent of Jesus Christ

verses on a spirit of adoption as sons:

- <sup>19</sup> For the anxious longing of the creation waits eagerly for the revealing of the sons of God.
- <sup>23</sup> And not only this, but also we ourselves, having the first fruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting eagerly for *our* adoption as sons, the redemption of our body.
- Gal 5:5 For we through the Spirit, by faith, are waiting for the hope of righteousness.

Now we have a wonderful result of our adoption ! by which – this refers back to the the Spirit (Holy Spirit) we cry out – *krazō* - loud proclamation of fact with emotion (present tense)

- The indwelling Holy Spirit is the reason we can cry out to God in this way
- an onomatopoeia word sounds like what it is !
- It is used of an inarticulate cry [our verse], cries from fear, cries from proclamation etc. edited Vine
- Matt 9:27b two blind men followed Him [Jesus], crying out, "Have mercy on us, Son of David!"
- John 7:37b Jesus stood and cried out, saying, "If anyone is thirsty, let him come to Me and drink."

- Now we have the believer's cry [loud proclamation of fact with emotion] to God - Abba! Father!
- Abba is an Aramaic word for Father
- Father is *pater* in the Greek language
- Paul used the Aramaic as well as the Greek term to highlight the intimate relationship we have\*
- Christ used Abba Father in His prayer in Gethsemane:
- Mark 14:36 And He was saying, "Abba! Father! All things are possible for You; remove this cup from Me; yet not what I will, but what You will."
- Two paraphrases of Abba! Father!: Father, my Father and My Father, my own dear Father\* \* Constable

#### Final Thoughts\*

- We have sought in vain for some simple English expression to set forth the Greek word so poorly rendered "adoption."
- This word is *huio-thesia*: from, *huios*, "son come of age"; and *thesia*, a placing, or setting a person or thing in its place.
- God's children are begotten and born of God, and are called *teknon*, "born-ones," of God.
- Thus are they directly related to God, "partakers of the Divine nature"
- But the word *huios* means, a child come of age; no longer "as a servant"
- This will be consummated fully at the coming of Christ, when our bodies, redeemed, and fashioned anew, shall be conformed to Christ's glorious body.
- Meanwhile, because we are already adult sons (*huios*), God has given us a spirit of adult-sonship! \* Newell
