 - What God has started He will continue to complete until the rapture; in fact, has the work in the Philippian church been completed now?
 - How does Paul bond with the church at Philippi?
 - you all are partakers with me of grace.
 - What are the specifics of Paul's request bringing God glory?
 - that your love may abound still more
 - approve the things that are excellent,
 - you may be sincere and without offense

 - most of the brethren are much bolder to speak the word without fear

 - Despite selfish ambition and not sincerely vs. out of love, whether in pretense or in truth, Christ is preached; and in this I rejoice, yes, and will rejoice.

- *Phil 1:19-26 To Live is Christ*
 - What does Paul know through the power of their prayer?
 - His deliverance
 - In nothing will he be ashamed.
 - Christ will be magnified in my body, whether by life or by death.
 - Why is verse 21 so very special 'For to me, to live is Christ, and to die gain.'?
 - It perfectly summarizes all that happened at Calvary, sins gone and our position with a new life lived not under law but in Christ by grace through the power of the Holy Spirit.
 - What are Paul's conclusions about continuing alive in the flesh vs. being with the Lord?
 - to depart and be with Christ, is far better.
 - His presence is more needed, & his fruit will reflect his labor.
 - His hope and joy anticipates his return to Philippi.

 - How will the body of Christ in Philippi be assessed for their conduct?
 - Are they standing fast in one spirit and in one mind for the faith in the gospel?
 - They are not being frightened by their adversaries, ...a proof of their salvation.
 - What about suffering and conflict?
 - On behalf of Christ, with belief expect suffering for His sake.
 - Were they really expected to have the same *conflict* as Paul; no, but when one of us suffers we all suffer with them.
 - Think endurance as if we were in an athletic event.
