- Some chapters in the Bible are written with Hebrew letters as a long acrostic, as if for memorizing the Hebrew alphabet, such as Psalm 111, 112 & 119, & also Lamentations 1

Acrostic Psalms:

9	2 verses for each of the 22 Hebrew consonants
10	2 verses each
25	1 verse each
34	1 verse each
37	2 verses each
111	$\frac{1}{2}$ verse each
112	$\frac{1}{2}$ verse each
119	8 verses each
145	1 verse each

Isaiah 28:9-13: Prophecy in Ancient Jewish Nursery Rhymes

To whom would He teach knowledge,
And to whom would He interpret the message?
Those just weaned from milk?
Those just taken from the breast?

10 For He says,

"Order on order, order on order,
Line on line, line on line,
A little here, a little there."

11 Indeed, He will speak to this people
Through stammering lips and a foreign tongue,
12 He who said to them, "Here is rest, give rest to the weary,"
And, "Here is repose," but they would not listen.

13 So the word of the LORD to them will be,

"Order on order, order on order,
Line on line, line on line,
A little here, a little there,"

That they may go and stumble backward, be broken, snared
and taken captive.
