Blessings to the Roman Believers

- 1:10 -15

Rom 1:10

Making request, if by any means now at length I might have a prosperous journey by the will of God to come unto you.

Question: What is Paul's prayer conditioned on?

- James 4:13-17; Phil 2:13

Question: Was it God's will that Paul have a prosperous journey?

"prosperous" - "easy to travel through" - difficulties removed

- Acts 27 & 28

Rom 1:11

For I long to see you, that I may impart unto you some spiritual gift, to the end ye may be established;

Question: What is Paul's purpose toward the believers in Rome?

Question: Is "some spiritual gift" the gift/s of the Holy Spirit as in 1Cor 12?

- "impart" To share with someone, to impart, communicate & not giving
- It is sharing the things of Christ for the purpose of "establishing" believers
- "establish" "to make steadfast in mind, confirm, strengthen' in the faith
- Note: God's purpose is to reproduce our Lord Jesus Christ in the life of every believer through edification via the word of God Eph 4:11-15



Blessings to the Roman Believers

- 1:10 -15

Rom 1:12

That is, that I may be comforted together with you by the mutual faith both of you and me.

Question: How are believers mutually comforted by each other?

What does this look like? - 2 Cor 1:3-6

Rom 1:13 (NAS)

And I do not want you to be unaware, brethren, that often I have planned to come to you (and have been prevented thus far) in order that I might obtain some fruit among you also, even as among the rest of the Gentiles.

Question: What was another purpose for Paul desiring to visit Rome?

Question: What fruit is Paul speaking about?

- Is it the same fruit he had among other Gentiles (soul winning) e.g. Acts 13:42-48?
- Or is it to have fruit in the lives of Roman Christians (edification) e.g. Rom 6:20-23?
- Or was it both ?



Blessings to the Roman Believers

- 1:10 -15

Rom 1:14

I am debtor both to the Greeks, and to the Barbarians; both to the wise, and to the unwise.

• "debtor" - "one who owes anything to another,"

Question: Why would Paul be a debtor or owe something to:

- The Greeks & the Barbarians This was a division of mankind made by the Greeks
 - Greeks were cultured, educated,& civilized
 - Barbarians all other peoples, those not speaking Greek
- The wise & the unwise Those possessing or not possessing God's wisdom
- The answer lies in the following reasons:
 - Paul owed them all his life and ministry because of the grace God bestowed on him
 - He was a debtor because he was an apostle called & selected by God
- Paul paid his debt by his preaching and writing

Rom 1:15

So, as much as in me is, I am ready (eager) to preach the gospel to you that are at Rome also.

Question: Why is Paul ready (eager) to preach the gospel to those in Rome?

Answer: Because of what the gospel contains as outlined in 1:16-18 (next week)
