Revelation of God to Man - 1:18-20

Rom 1:19 (KJV)

Because that which may be known of God is manifest in them; for God hath showed it unto them.

Question: Who is the "them" (2x) in this passage?

• It refers back to vs.18 – It is all un-regenerative men who are "holding down" or "suppressing" the truth (about God) in unrighteousness

Question: Why does man hold down or suppress the truth in unrighteousness?

Would you expect any other response?

Does it have to do with the very nature of man?

- Recognize that the state of man's being & very nature is unrighteousness "As it is written, There is none righteous, no, not one: " - Rom 3:10 (KJV)
- Because un-regenerative man is energized by his Adamic (sin) nature, it can only manifest itself in unrighteousness (internal & external) – therefore man can only suppress the truth about God

Question: How is it possible then for man to not suppress the truth & believe?

- Jn 6:44; 12:32; 16:8,9




Revelation of God to Man - 1:18-20

Rom 1:19 (KJV)

Because that which may be known of God is manifest in them; for God hath showed it unto them.

Question: How has God conveyed the truth about Himself to unrighteous man?

Lit: "the known of God is manifest in them"



"the known" - γνωστός, *gnōstos -* signifies "known, or knowable;"

- the "emphatically knowable" (definite article)
- "of God" the things about God which He revealed to man
- "Is" eimi, eimi essence verb of status quo continuous existence, pres/ act/ind
- "manifest" φανερός, phaneros apparent, clear, evident, (opposite to "in secret")
 - "in them" in the heart & mind of man, the truth about God is very clear & plain
 - It's emphatic God Himself makes the knowledge of Himself totally clear to man, by the statement: "for God has showed (φανερόω phanerόō) it unto them

Revelation of God to Man - 1:18-20

<u>1:19 Summary</u>

- Verse 19 states the reason why God reveals His wrath (His settled anger out from His righteousness) toward unrighteous man
 - Because God has placed in all men the emphatically knowable truth about Himself but man suppresses that truth
 - The truth of God is continually (24 x 7) and emphatically made clear to mankind but man still continues to hold down or suppress the truth
- No man can say:
 - "There is no God"
 - "I can't know if there is a God"
- From God's viewpoint :
 - There are no atheists
 - There are no agnostics
- Sinful man holds down or suppresses his knowledge of God in his unrighteousness because that is the very state of his being
- Because God is righteous, He must pour out His wrath & indignation on man
- Man has a choice:
 - God's blessing by faith (The believer is at rest)
 - God's wrath by unbelief (The unbeliever is at unrest)



Revelation of God to Man - 1:18-20

Rom 1:20 (KJV)

For the invisible things of him from the creation of the world are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even his eternal power and Godhead; so that they are without excuse:

Question: What are the emphatically knowable things of God that are intrinsic in man?

Question: How long has man had this knowledge of God?

Question: What does verse 20 say about God's eternal power & Godhead (Deity)?

- 1. They are invisible ἀόρατος, aóratos; 'a'- not, and horáō to see that which cannot be seen with the physical eyes = Invisible
- They are clearly seen καθοράω, kathoráō; to perceive clearly, understand (apart from visual sight)
- 3. They are understood by the things made ποίημα, poiēma; It denotes the result of a work, what is produced (i.e. creation)

Question: What is God's response to man who suppresses the truth about God's eternal power and Godhead (Deity)?

Man is without excuse - ἀναπολόγητος, *anapológētos*; Without apology or excuse, inexcusable
