

mind (nous) - denotes, speaking generally, the seat of reflective consciousness, comprising the faculties of perception and understanding ---; (c) the new nature, which belongs to the believer by reason of the new birth,

serving (douleuō) - to serve as a "doulos"--- to be a slave to (literal or figurative, involuntary or voluntary) - be in bondage,

Romans 6:19 I am speaking in human terms because of the weakness of your flesh. For just as you presented your members as slaves to impurity and to lawlessness, resulting in *further* lawlessness, so now present your members as <u>slaves</u> to righteousness, resulting in sanctification. Also see 1 Pete 2:16





Ro 7:22	22 For I joyfully concur with the law of God in the inner man,

flesh – (sarx) usage notes: has a wider range of meaning in the NT --- "the seat of sin in man" (but this is not the same thing as the body), "flesh" is contrasted with spirit; in Rom. 2:28, 29, with heart and spirit; in Rom. 7:25, with the mind. (Vine)





Ro 7:23	23 but I see a different law in the members of my body, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin which is in my members.
